How does the government raise its tax revenue? What tax structure is fair? What structure is efficient? In this seminar we discuss the pros and cons of alternative types of taxes. Since all taxes are levied on some type of economic activity, understanding the efficiency of alternative types of taxes is dependent on how people respond to the incentives created by the taxes. We discuss the efficiency and equity of the personal and corporate income taxes, the payroll tax, and value-added and consumption taxes.
